C. DELEGATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

1. BCRPA Symposium

E. Erickson provided a presentation and report from the BCRPA Symposium that took place April 27-29 in Whistler. The theme of the symposium was "Elevating Recreation". He provided the following information:

- Keynote speaker, Tory Glover, Professor at the Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies, University of Waterloo, spoke on "A Call for Action for Parks and Recreation". He commented on healthy communities and the need for more places for people to connect face to face beyond home and work i.e. mixed activity parks. Residents are looking for public places with meaning and value.
- Kelowna has recently won the PERC Award for Management, Innovation, and Ingenuity for their "Connection – Engagement – Attachment" program. This program promotes social connectivity for health and wellness benefits. 1500 residents attended 24 sessions in neighbourhood parks to gather input on which characteristics they valued in a neighbourhood. The results were: proximity to daily amenities, access to nature and green space, ability to move freely through neighbourhoods, and social connections. The city invested \$10,000 for a mobile event kit for community events that includes tables, chairs, signs, and a staff person. Two toolkits were also developed: "Good Neighbour Toolkit" and "Strong Neighbourhood Toolkit".
- Keynote speaker, Dr. Dean Kriellaars, College of Rehabilitation Sciences, University of Manitoba, spoke on "The Gateway to Physical Activity". He commented on how recreation can enhance its contribution in the provision of quality physical literacy experiences across the lifespan and for all ability levels. He stated that inactivity is now the number one leading cause of death with only 3% of people meeting recommended activity levels, and obesity at 28%.

H. OTHER BUSINESS AND ITEMS FOR INFORMATION

1. **Sports Field Management Course**

P. Tulumello reported that the Township of Langley will partner with Kwantlen Polytechnic University, Western Canada Turfgrass Association, and Sports Turf Canada to provide an outdoor educational program to a group of Langley Secondary School grade 9 students. The course will be called "First Sportsfield" and is the first of its kind in North America.

2. **Tradition and Innovation in First Nations Art**

P. Tulumello reported that the opening reception for the exhibition "Tradition and Innovation in First Nations Art" will take place on May 14 from 1:00 – 4:00pm and the Langley Centennial Museum. He also noted that Kwantlen First Nation has received funding to develop a temporary exhibition based on a territorial knowledge project that they undertook in 2015, which will be presented at the Museum in 2017.

3. **Community Grants**

P. Tulumello reported that the Community Grants deadline has been extended to May 31 for those organizations that did not meet all of the criteria.

5. **Arts and Culture Conference**

K. Ludlam suggested a member of the RCPAC attend an arts and culture conference similar to the BCRPA conference.

6. **Museum Advisory Group**

K. Ludlam requested that a report from the Museum Advisory Group be added to future agendas as an ongoing item. She reported that the HVAC system is moving along, the new fence and storage areas will be built this summer, and that the Heritage Fair was a huge success.

RE: Brookwood-Fernridge Community Plan Update

The Township of Langley is in the early stages of a planning process to update the Brookwood-Fernridge Community Plan. The Brookwood-Fernridge area is located in the southwest of the Township of Langley and has a current population of approximately 13,360.

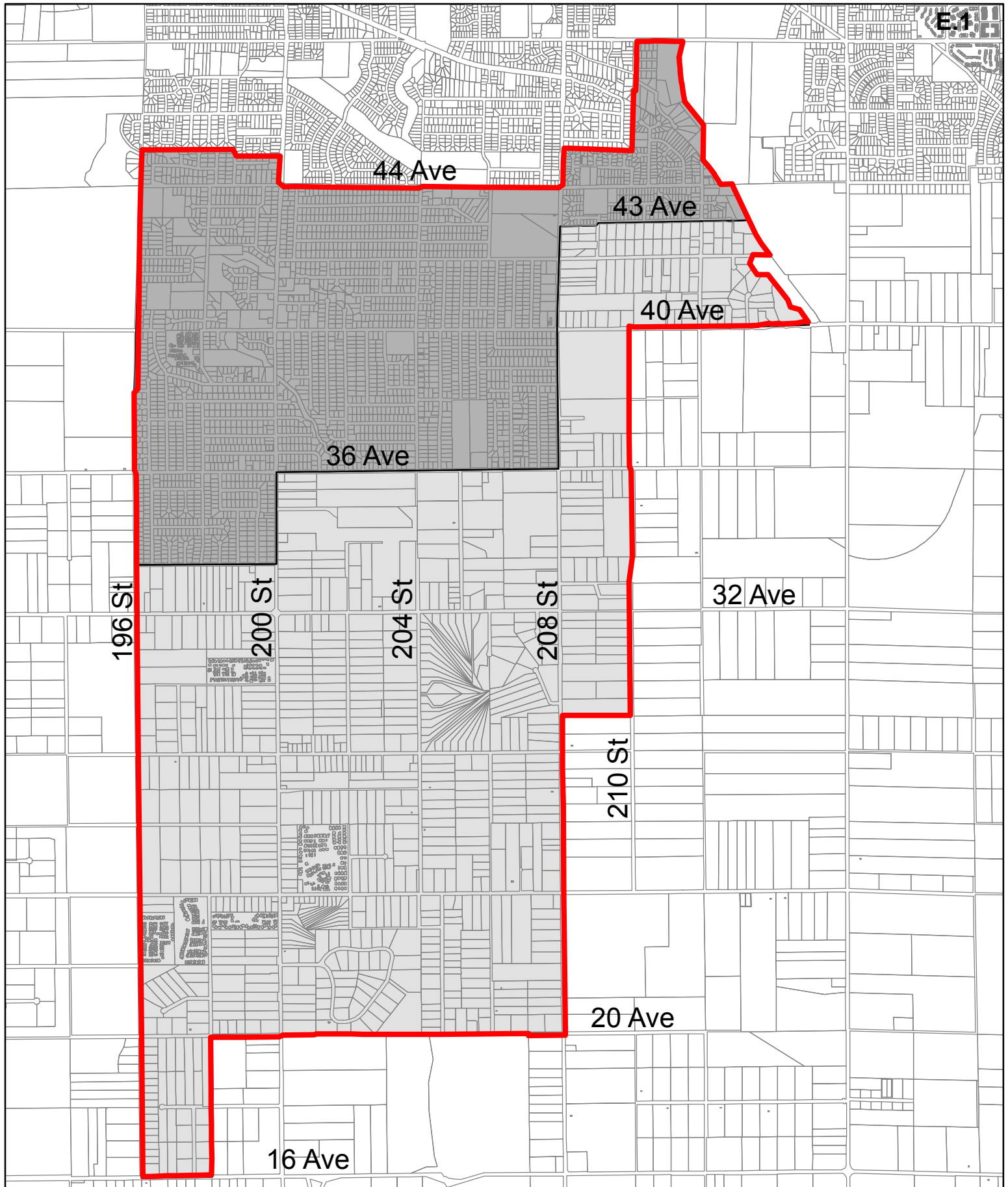
The existing Brookwood-Fernridge Community Plan was adopted by Township Council in 1987. The Plan provides a long term vision for the area as an urban community and includes policies to guide future development. The existing Community Plan forecasts an ultimate population of approximately 35,000 residents for the area.

The update to the Community Plan will focus primarily on the “Undeveloped Area” of Brookwood-Fernridge to provide opportunities for growth and redevelopment in the “Undeveloped Area” while maintaining the existing land uses and densities in the “Developed Area” (see attached map). It is anticipated that the updated Brookwood-Fernridge Community Plan will accommodate an ultimate population between 35,000 and 43,000 residents. 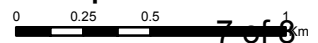
