Water Local Area Service Bylaw

Bylaw No. 5238 Report 16-103 File ENG 5320-020

**Recommendation:** That Council give first, second and third reading to Local Area

Service Bylaw 2016 No. 5238.

Explanation - Bylaw No. 5238

Bylaw 2016 No. 5238 establishes the construction of municipal watermain along 64 Avenue, 216 Street, 224 Street, 226 Street, 63 Avenue unopened road allowance, and Provincial Highway #10 as a local area service and authorizes the recovery of the costs of constructing the local area service by means of a local service tax.

G.2 2016 Amendments to the Permissive Tax Exemption Bylaws

Bylaw No. 5242 Report 16-98 File FIN 1970-04

Recommendation: That Council give first, second, and third reading to Permissive Tax

Exemption Amending Bylaw 2016 No. 5242.

Explanation - Bylaw No. 5242

Section 224(2) (a) of the Community Charter provides for a tax exemption for land or improvements that are owned or held by a charitable, philanthropic or other not-for-profit organizations. Council considers charitable, philanthropic or other not-for-profit organizations which are supported in whole, or in part, by public funds and used exclusively for charitable and philanthropic purposes.
