## I. OTHER BUSINESS

Councillor Fox presented the following Notices of Motion within the deadlines according to Council's policy:

### 1.1 **Tree Protection Bylaw**

Recommendation: Whereas at the Council Meeting of March 5, 2018 Ms. Hanae Sakurai made a delegation to Council regarding the need for a Tree Protection Bylaw in the Township;

> Whereas the Council work plan for the 2018 calendar and budget year has been determined as per the last Council priority planning session facilitated by Mr. Gordon McIntosh; and

Whereas staff is fully engaged in fulfilling the expectations of that work plan on top of their day to day project workload and further that budget and staff funding would be necessary to form and carry out the work of the standing committee and any recommendations that were derived from their recommendations:

Therefore be it resolved that the recommendation of the formation of a standing committee to review a Tree Protection Bylaw for the Township of Langley be put as an item of consideration on the agenda of the Council Planning and Priority Workshop of the new term of office for those elected to Council on October 20th; and further

Be it resolved that any recommendations requiring additional funds (materials or staffing positions) be a part of the 2019 budget cycle discussion.

### 1.2 **Community Input Group Task Force**

### **Recommendation:** Whereas:

- a. The Mayor's Standing Committee on Public Engagement demonstrated the need to continually reach out to the public for input and feedback;
- b. The recent promotion of Community Associations reinforces the need for transparent, proactive consultation;
- c. The Township of Langley is comprised of six (6) communities consisting of Aldergrove, Murrayville, Fort Langley, Walnut Grove, Willoughby, and Brookswood;
- d. Public input must come from all facets of the community including the business community, school district, concerned residents, and the recreation and cultural communities; and

e. Input from the community can be received from individuals or organizations who maintain a balanced, non-partisan, proactive, non-political approach to ensuring that residents' needs are taken into consideration as part of council priority setting sessions;

### Therefore be it resolved that:

- 1. A Community Input Group Task Force be formed to consist of one (1) individual community representative from each of the aforementioned six (6) communities (total of six (6)), one individual from the business community from each of the six (6) identified communities (BA's, BIA's in particular), (total of six (6)), and one (1) appointed by Council to serve as chairperson, one (1) member from the agricultural community, and one (1) member from the recreation and culture community, for a total Community Input Group Task Force of fifteen (15);
- 2. Each member of Council shall be appointed to the Community Input Group Task Force (total of twenty-four (24));
- 3. Each public member of the Community Input Group Task Force will be selected by Council and must agree that they are participating as a community volunteer on a Community Input Group Task Force and confirm that they will not be engaged proactively either as a candidate or special interest group;
- 4. The Community Input Group Task Force will meet once per month, as scheduled by staff in April, May, and June;
- 5. All members of Council be encouraged to actively participate in the sessions;
- 6. The meetings will be facilitated (with the facilitator having no direct connection to the community) with funds coming to support this initiative from Council Contingency; and
- 7. The Community Input Group Task Force shall deliberate and provide recommendations to council within four months such that it may be important and significant component in the Township of Langley's Planning Workshop and 2019 budget deliberations.
