

McClughan Park Committee Proposal: McClughan Park Learning Facility

Let's Create a Learning Legacy and Recreation Space for Our Walnut Grove Children & Community Members



Vision

Our McClughan Park Committee's desire is to partner with the Township of Langley to create a learning facility for students, community members and groups. This includes a covered picnic table area, pit latrine and a community garden. This would be for the westside of McClughan Park in Walnut Grove, facing 204th Street.

Basis

- 1. Research supports the need for children learning and caring about nature in outdoor spaces for wellness purposes.
- 2. The park was first developed in the 1980s, and now decades later we believe there needs to be attention and improvement to this section of McClughan Park.
- 3. Creates ownership and partnership between two schools Gordon Greenwood Elementary and Dorothy Peacock Elementary. Together the schools service approximately 900 children. Outdoor education is important to educators in both buildings.
- 4. Utilizes space to provide families and community groups an area of gathering to enhance the leisure and recreation throughout the seasons and different types of weather conditions.
- 5. Relieves the waitlist on Community Gardens of Walnut Grove, near Walnut Grove high school and Topham elementary school.
