## C. PRESENTATIONS

### D. <u>UPDATES</u>

### 1. Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project

N. Horsford provided an update on the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 (RBT2) Expansion Project. The following information was provided:

- Panel hearings took place over the summer in Delta and Vancouver to review the project;
- The Panel will complete their report and submit to the Minister in early 2020 with the hopes of having a decision made in the second quarter of 2020;
- This project will take 3-5 years to complete.

Discussion ensued and the following comments were provided by the Advisory Panel:

- The RBT2 project will increase the amount of rail traffic to and from the facility which will have traffic implications in lower mainland municipalities in which the rail crosses through.
- A Gateway Transportation Collaboration Forum (GTCF) was created with representatives from the province, federal government, Vancouver Port Authority to review RBT2 impacts to transportation infrastructure and prioritise projects for possible grant funding applications and partnerships. Funding has been received for some projects which are now underway or completed.
- Municipalities were involved peripherally but it was noted that they need to be more involved with the process and be local advocates for these projects;
- For the previous port expansion (prior to RBT2) an "Agreement in Principle" was signed by 17 partners for the previous Roberts Bank Rail corridor which stated which projects should be pursued;
- A similar process may be undertaken for the projects identified in the GTCF Roberts Bank Trade Corridor Study and the GTCF Fraser River Trade Corridor Study.

## D. <u>UPDATES</u>

### 2. Milner Railway Crossing Upgrades/Crush Crescent

M. LoVecchio provided a brief update on the Milner Crossing and reported that the repairs are working well. He stated that the concrete panels are very robust and should hold up well.

Staff reported that the Township if pursuing gates and flashers at the Smith Crossing and that they are working with MoTI who is managing the project, and CP Rail in regards to scope and budget for the 216 Crossing.

## 3. Railway Crossing Information System Project

P. Cordeiro reported that the new detection equipment has been installed and works fine on the consultants server, but does not work on the new server that the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) has installed.

**Action:** Request the Mayor's of the City and Township of Langley send a letter to MOTI encouraging them to remedy this situation quickly and have the Rail Crossing Information System working soon.

P. Cordeiro noted that the new Transport Regulations begin in November 2021.
