

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receive the Fort Langley Community Park Public Engagement Update Report for information and provide direction to staff based on the information presented and outlined in the Financial Implications section of this report.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

At its November 9, 2020 Regular Meeting, Council endorsed the public engagement strategy; and directed staff to proceed with obtaining community feedback and to bring the results, including potential next steps, forward for Council's consideration.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, public engagement was held online in a digital format between March 8 and April 19, 2021. The primary mechanism for feedback was a web-based public survey which was also available in printed hard copy by request. Approximately 1,000 completed surveys were submitted.

Respondents were provided with a list of amenities that currently exist in Township of Langley parks and were asked which of those they would be most interested in for the Fort Langley Community Park. The top three priorities identified are listed below in priority order:

1. Outdoor Seasonal Pool;
2. Adventure (Parkour) Park (consisting of obstacles, such as climbing walls, balance beams, stairs, ledges, rails, etc.); and
3. Spray Park.

Converting the existing pool into a spray park is the option recommended by staff based on the overall public cost/benefit analysis.

A complete copy of the public engagement results is provided as Attachment A. Once a preferred option has been identified by Council, staff will develop an updated project scope, timeline, cost estimates and anticipated required budget.

PURPOSE:

To present findings from the public engagement feedback regarding current and future park uses and amenities and seek Council direction on next steps.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

The existing Fort Langley Outdoor Pool was originally constructed approximately 60 years ago. Due to ongoing operational challenges, age of the facility, and the need for significant capital investment, an assessment was undertaken in 2019. The assessment revealed several concerns relating to public health, safety, functionality, liability, and compliance.

On January 27, 2020, staff presented the findings of the assessment to Council and the following motion was carried:

That Council direct staff to proceed with conversion of the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool to an outdoor community splash pad and spray park.

Staff proceeded with the design process and public engagement on the various elements of the spray park. The goal being to bring forward a budgetary estimate to include in the 2021 budget for Council's consideration and on approval, have the construction completed prior to the 2021 spray park season.

On September 21, 2020 at its Regular Meeting, Council resolved as follows regarding the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool:

1. *Council to ask staff to place any further action on the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool Replacement Plan on hold until an extensive public input opportunity on the merits of this plan has been held.*

Motion was referred to staff, for a report to include the process for public input opportunity and the cost of the various pool repair and replacement options.

2. *That a Public Input Opportunity be set up in a "Public Hearing Style Format" at the next open meeting of Township Council to receive comments from the public.*

Motion was deferred until after the staff report on the public engagement process and costing has been received.

3. *That Council have a full discussion on the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool Replacement Plan at an open Council meeting.*

Motion was Carried.

4. *That Council revisit at this open Council meeting whether or not to proceed further on the replacement of the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool with a Splash Park.*

Motion was Carried.

At its Regular Meeting on November 9, 2020, Council carried the following resolution regarding the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool.

That Council endorse the public engagement strategy outlined in this report; and direct staff to proceed with the proposed framework to obtain feedback regarding the Fort Langley Outdoor Pool and bring forward the results, including potential next steps, for Council's consideration.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

As directed by Council at the November 9, 2020 meeting, staff proceeded with undertaking public engagement to gather feedback about current park use and considerations for future park amenities including possible replacement of the outdoor pool.

The public engagement took place between March 8 and April 19, 2021. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, public engagement was held online in a digital format. The primary mechanism for feedback was a web-based public survey. The survey was also available in printed hard copy upon request.



Public Survey Results

A total of 983 surveys were completed and consisted of 11 questions, 4 of which were demographic questions. The survey has been included as Attachment A - Fort Langley Community Park Engagement Summary Report.

Below are the main findings from the survey, in no particular order. For questions with multiple answers allowed, combined percentage figures will exceed 100%.

- Overall, 97% of the respondents indicated that they live in the Township of Langley. Of those, the majority live in Fort Langley and Walnut Grove.
- Survey respondents were asked what activities they participate in most when visiting the park, with up to three options allowed. The top three responses include:




- Respondents were provided with a list of amenities that currently exist in Township of Langley parks, and asked which of those they would be most interested in for the park, with up to three choices allowed. The following were the top 4 results:

Note: Adventure/Parkour Park is a park consisting of obstacles like climbing walls, balance beams, stairs, ledges, and rails. The closest example is Penzer Park in the City of Langley.

- As per Council direction, an open format section was provided for respondents to share any other new amenities they would like to see in the Park, should the Township choose to reimagine the park space. 379 respondents provided a response. A complete list has been provided in Attachment A.
- In order to assess community priorities for the park, respondents were asked to select what was most important to them in updating the park, with up to two priorities allowed, and the results are shown below:



- The final question of the survey was open-ended and provided an opportunity for respondents to share their thoughts about the current and future amenities of Fort Langley Community Park. These survey comments were coded, and the following emerging themes were identified:
 - Pool is a priority
 - Larger pool is preferred
 - Amenities for all ages and abilities
 - Retain trees and natural spaces

Environmental Implications:

To achieve the emissions reduction goals set out in the Climate Action Strategy, all new corporate facilities need to be zero carbon in operation. Depending on the preferred option, more investigation will be required to determine how best to minimize the carbon footprint, and to estimate the related costs.

Financial Implications:

In the November 9, 2020 Council Report a number of options were presented with recommendations for Council's consideration.

The cost estimates have not been updated from information presented in previous reports, based on more current prevailing market conditions. With that, it should also be noted that the cost estimations are presented as an order of magnitude for comparison purposes and are to be considered as high-level estimates of the capital cost and associated general tax impact for reference.

Generally, prior to more detailed costing assessment, it would be necessary to develop a clear scope and undertake a detailed design process. Financial impact, relating to capital costs, will vary significantly depending on the option selected.

Previous Options*			
Option	Description	Est. Capital Cost**	Est. Tax Impact***
Option 1: Minimum Upgrades	Addresses only the critical issues at the facility. This has a very high level of associated risk. While this option may appear appealing due to its estimated cost, it is not recommended , as it may not be possible, it may cost significantly more and will not address long term issues and associated costs.	\$0.5 M	0.4%
Option 2: Major Renovations	Major upgrades to the facility to deal with the majority of the concerns outlined in the assessment. However, this is not recommended due to the significant costs involved, high level of risks, and the relatively low associated benefits.	\$2.3 M	1.7%
Option 3: Facility Replacement at Current Site (<i>like-for-like</i>)	This is a like-for-like replacement of the existing outdoor pool on the current site, with another same size/configuration pool based on current codes and health guidelines. It would consist of minimum upgrades to meet current codes and regulations. However, this option is not recommended due to the small size and depth of the pool and limited aquatic programming.	\$3 M to \$4 M	2.2% to 2.9%
Option 4: Conversion to a Spray Park	Convert the existing pool site to a Spray Park. This option is recommended by staff based on the overall public cost-benefit analysis.	\$1 M	0.7%

Option 5: Facility Replacement at Current Site (or a different location in the Park) based on an Expanded Footprint	Construct a new (single tank) outdoor <u>four lane 25 m pool</u> . To accommodate a larger pool footprint and additional components/structures (e.g. change rooms, washrooms, pool building, chemical storage, etc.). Some of the following elements will need to be taken into consideration under this option: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduce the expansion of the Fort Langley Cemetery; • Removal of significant trees and greenspace; • Deconstruction of the existing caretaker residence; • Loss of the sports field to accommodate the new facility. 	\$7.5 M	5.4%
Option 6: Other (non-aquatic) Park Improvements	Decommission the existing site and seek public feedback on potential non-aquatic enhancements that could provide for more year-round use and appeal to a diverse age group. This could include one or more of the following: sports courts, skate park, bike park, adventure playground, etc. Similar to Option 5, the elements listed above will also need to be considered. ** This is a high-level capital estimate (order of magnitude for comparison purposes) that does not factor in any operating costs, cost to mitigate potential climate impacts and is not based on any design

*** This is estimated as the one-year tax impact that assumes new funding

Conclusion:

Based on the results of the public engagement, it is clear the majority of respondents prefer an outdoor seasonal pool. From the list of potential options, pool replacement is the most expensive option from both the initial capital expenditure as well as ongoing operating and maintenance perspective. Staff request direction from Council on the next steps.

Engagement Summary - Fort Langley Community Park

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1.0 Introduction

This document provides a summary of engagement activities and public feedback for the replacement of the community pool within the Fort Langley Community Park. Originally constructed in 1962, the pool at the Fort Langley Community Park (the Park) has been closed to the public for health and safety reasons. Reopening the pool in its current condition is not permitted. Township of Langley Council requested staff survey the public to gather feedback about current park use and thoughts for future park amenities, including possible replacement of the outdoor pool.

2.0 Engagement

Due to COVID-19, public engagement was held online in a digital format between March 8 and April 19, 2021. The primary mechanism for feedback was a web-based public survey, which was also available in printed hard copy, by request. In total, 983 completed surveys were submitted. The following table provides a summary of total engagement.

2.1 Advertising

The survey was advertised via the following methods:

- Township webpage
- Social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram)
- Newspaper ads

- Poster boards at the park

Public engagement over social media was high, with the first Facebook post was shared 39 times. Within 1 day of launch, the survey had been taken by 561 respondents, indicating a high level of community interest.

We want to hear from you! The outdoor seasonal pool at the [Fort Langley Community Park](#), originally constructed in 1962, has been closed to the public for health and safety reasons. Reopening the pool in its current configuration would require significant upgrades.

Township of Langley Council requested staff survey the public to gather feedback about current park use and thoughts for future park amenities, including possible replacement of the outdoor pool. The results of this survey will be presented to Township of Langley Council this summer for their consideration.

Quick facts about the space

- The park is home to 102 trees, many close to 150 years old. As maintaining a tree canopy is important, tree root systems may limit amenity options that require underground expansion.
- The adjacent parking lot is shared with the Fort Langley Cemetery (23105 St. Andrews Avenue). A cemetery expansion is planned which will have impacts on available parking.
- The outdoor pool was built 59 years ago and is typically open seasonally, from mid-June to early September.
- A 2019 assessment of the pool found health and safety concerns and that the facility is not up-to-date with current codes and standards.
- The pool's small size limits swimming lesson options due to depth, length, and overall space.
- The pool site includes a change room and small concession.



3.0 Survey Results

A total of 983 surveys were submitted during the survey period March 8 to April 19, 2021. The survey consisted of 11 questions, 4 of which were demographic questions. The survey can be viewed in Appendix A.


3.1 Demographics

Overall, 97% of respondents indicated that they live in the Township of Langley, with the majority living in either Fort Langley or Walnut Grove.




To better understand household composition, respondents were asked the ages of people in their households. The most common age range was 35-44 years, followed by 6-10 years. There was also a relatively high number of children in multiple other age groups, indicating that many respondents have families with children.

Ages of People in Household




3.2 Current Park Usage

Survey results indicate that the Fort Langley Community Park is well used throughout the year, with over 30% of respondents reporting that they visit the park at least once a week in each of the seasons. Reported usage is higher in the summer, and users are more likely to report that they never or rarely visit in the winter.




3.3 Travel Modes

Respondents were asked how they typically travel to and from the park, with up to two choices allowed. The most frequent responses were driving (park on site) and walking (51% each), followed by cycling (26%).



3.4 Park Activities

Survey respondents were asked what activities they participate in most when visiting the Park, with up to three options allowed. The top responses include: public swimming (54%), playground (52%), walking (41%), swimming lessons (31%), relaxation/leisure (30%) and picnic (22%).




3.5 Park Amenities

3.5.1 Existing Amenities

Respondents were provided with a list of amenities that currently exist in Langley parks, and asked which of those they would be most interested in for the Fort Langley Community Park, with up to three choices allowed. Each amenity was accompanied by a dollar figure range to indicate the relative cost. The amenity selected most frequently was an outdoor seasonal pool, with 78% of respondents selecting this option. Other favoured amenities included adventure/parkour park (35%), spray park (28%), and expanded open space for activities, leisure and relaxation (23%).

3.5.2 New Amenity Ideas


In an open format, respondents were asked what new amenities they would like to see in the Park should the Township choose to reimagine the Park space. 379 respondents provided a response. Of the new ideas suggested, a short list is provided below (in no particular order), with the full list of comments provided in Appendix B.

- Summer concession/food trucks
- Natural play structures (rocks, tree trunks)
- Accessible playground for all abilities
- Zip line
- Indoor pool
- Hot tub
- Stage for music/festivals
- Screen for outdoor movies
- Public art
- Multiuse pathway
- BBQ pits
- Interpretive panels for trees and local flora
- Gender-neutral washrooms
- Bocce courts
- Concrete ping pong tables
- Chess tables
- Solar water filling station
- Rose garden
- Water slides
- Astronomy tools
- Skate park
- Climbing wall
- Arts and activity programming
- Bike storage, e-bike charging
- Sheltered spaces (from rain, sun)
- Shallow streams/water features for younger children

3.6 Important Considerations

Respondents were asked to select what were the two most important items for them in updating the Park.

Retaining/replacing the outdoor seasonal pool was the most selected priority at 69%, with retaining trees and open space at 45%, and amenities for all ages at 18% as the second and third priorities. Minimizing impact on property taxes was not indicated as a high priority, with only 6% of respondents selecting this option.

A high level analysis of survey comments identified the following emerging themes.

- Pool is a priority
- Larger pool preferred
- Amenities for all ages and abilities
- Retain trees and natural spaces




Q1 How often do you typically visit Fort Langley Community Park each season?






Q8 Do you live or work in the Township of Langley?


