### 1. Cultural Services Update

P. Tulumello provided a presentation with a Cultural Services Report for 2015/16. He noted that one of the goals from the Township of Langley Sustainable Charter, adopted in 2008, is "nourishing the arts as an expression of cultural value". He further noted that the Arts and Cultural Services Plan was adopted in 2011 and the Vision from that plan is "the enrichment of an Arts and Cultural Community that create diversity for future generations". The Mission is "to support and encourage partnership that contribute to a diverse arts and cultural community". The Township has connections with the following groups:

- Trinity Western University
- Coast Salish Arts and Culture Society
- Other Community Museums and Societies

First Nation Collaborations are as follows:

# 3. RCPAC attendance at Cultural Conferences

Tulumello noted that there are only funds in the budget to send one committee member to one conference per year and that perhaps the conferences should alternate each year between a recreation focus and a cultural focus. Staff will research other British Columbia based culture learning / networking opportunities prior to RCPAC's decision regarding conference attendance for 2017. Staff will also make a presentation at the November meeting regarding their attendance at the Creative Cities Network Summit being held in Surrey in October 2016.
