D.1 2019 Budget Public Consultation Results

S. Nam provided a summary of the public input received at the Budget Open Houses held February 19 and 20, 2019. He stated that 51% of respondents support a proposed tax increase of 2.93%, 21% were neutral, and 28% opposed. The top three important issues for respondents were parks, growth, and transportation/crime. The voting results for the items that Council flagged for public consultation were provided: McLeod Athletic Park, 208 Street Corridor, 216 Street Improvements: Highway 1 to 96 Avenue, Traffic Signal at Glover Road and 96 Avenue, Road Construction and Street Lighting on McBride Lane, sidewalk on 206 Street between 4200 and 440 block, sidewalk improvements on 272 Street between 28 and 29 Avenue, Langley Hospice Society DCC supports, and the Lower Mainland Flood Management Study.

A. Jensen provided a presentation regarding the Community Amenity Contributions (CACs) Policy. He provided the following implications for the revisions that Council proposed:

- Increase target contributions amounts by 20% Would generate \$18 million (net) in CACs to be used for additional amenities.
- Exempt the Aldergrove Core Area from the policy would redistribute the financial burden of \$10.5 million to other communities.
- Add a new Aldergrove Core Area Amenity Fund Recommend further study to determine best use of funds to incentivize redevelopment.
- Redefine policy as Amenity Zoning Bylaw Recommend Phased Development Agreements as CAC collection tool.
- Revise grace period to a "step-up" approach Recommend consideration for compliance with principles of legitimate expectations and prior consultation with the development industry.
- Freeze target contribution amounts Would freeze CAC amounts until 2022.
