A.1 Council Process Committee Agenda - January 11, 2021

B. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

B.1 Murrayville and Brookswood Water Quality Improvements Report 20-125 File ENG 5330-27-82

Council continued discussing the motion from staff from the November 30, 2020 CPC Meeting regarding Murrayville and Brookswood Water Quality Improvements:

That the Council Process Committee recommends that Council direct staff to include funding in the amount of \$6,000,000 in the 2021 Water Utility budget for Council's consideration of approval to enable construction of the three (3) localized water treatment plants for the Murrayville and Brookswood areas, and authorize staff to proceed with the necessary detailed design work, utilizing funding currently available in the Water Utility account.

The following comments were provided:

- What are the costing models of the recommendations from staff?
- This motion should be moved along to the budget process as time is a concern.

• We do not know the full costs of our COVID-19 recovery costs yet and should not jump into a \$6,000,000 Water Treatment Plant at this time. There are still many unknowns regarding timeline and costs.

• A presentation from Metro Vancouver regarding their long-term plans would be helpful before moving forward.

- Why are we duplicating Metro Vancouver infrastructure?
- Why are we using temporary measures and not something more permanent?
- Could staff provide more information about the financial implications?

• The cost of water is not just reflected in a monetary perspective, but rather an environmental and social perspective as well.

- Blended water can be a false economy.
- Should we look at water metering?
